CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PARENTS/CARERS



As a parent/carer of a child taking part in Judo at Eurokwai, we'd like you to:

- make sure your child has their judo suit and belt with them at every lesson
- try to make sure your child arrives to lessons on time and is picked up promptly; or let us know if you're running late or if your child is going home with someone else.
- do not allow your child to wander around the Leisure Centre unaccompanied, it is imperative that all children are brought to and collected from Studio 1 by their parents/carers.
- complete all consent and contact forms and update us straight away of anything changes
- report any medical treatment your child may be undergoing, or any newly diagnosed condition, to Miss Murray
- maintain a good relationship with your child's instructors and catch up with them about your child's development
- talk to us if you have any concerns about any part of your child's involvement — we want to hear from you
- ensure that you and your child understand the [code of conduct for students](#)
- respect the rights, dignity and worth of all students/instructors/parents and carers regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background, religious beliefs or sexual identity
- help your child to recognise good performance not just results and talk to them about embracing good etiquette and sportsmanship, discourage them from unfair play and arguing with Instructors, Remember that children get a wide range of benefits from participating in Judo, like making friends, getting exercise and developing skills, it's not all about winning and losing or fighting
- never force your child to take part in Judo, listen when they say they don't want to do something
- accept instructors judgements
- use correct and proper language at all times
- leave the coaching to the instructors
- do not enter the Judo studio or go onto the mats uninvited
- think about how the way you react and behave effects not just your child but other children too
- use social media responsibly when talking about what goes on at our club, by behaving in the same way online as you would in person

As a parent/carer, we understand you have the right to:

- be assured that your child is safeguarded during their time with us
- know that Alison Murray is Eurokwai's Welfare and Safeguarding Officer and can be contacted in person on club lesson days or via the contact details at the top of this document
- see our Safeguarding Child Protection Policy and Procedures at any time, which are available on our web site ([click here to view](#)) or in hard copy from Alison Murray
- have any concerns about any aspect of your child's welfare listened and responded to
- know the training and qualifications instructors have
- be informed of problems or concerns relating to your child
- be informed if your child is injured and see records of any accidents
- know that no photographs and/or filming of your child will ever take place
- know that Eurokwai does not utilise social media and will never contact your child via social media, electronic messaging or email

We expect all parents/carers to follow the behaviours and requests set out in this code. If any parent/carer behaves in a way which contradicts any of the points set out above, we'll address the problem straight away with them and aim to resolve the issue. Persistent concerns or breaches may result in parents/carers being asked not to attend lessons if their attendance is considered a risk to the welfare and enjoyment of young participants. Continued issues and repeated breaches of this code may result in us regrettably asking your child to leave the activity, event or club permanently, although this is something we never want to do it is a right we reserve.
